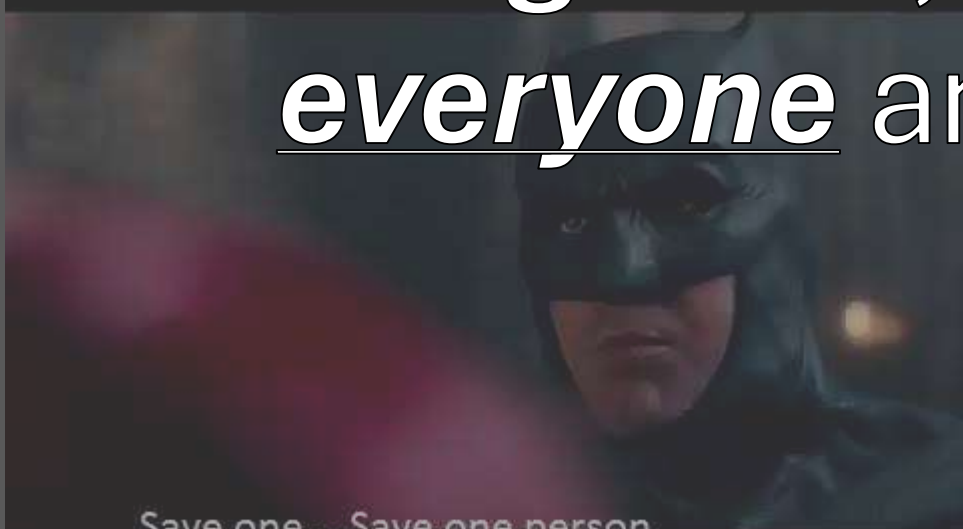
In *Justice League*, Batman tells the overwhelmed

Flash, “Just save *one* person.”



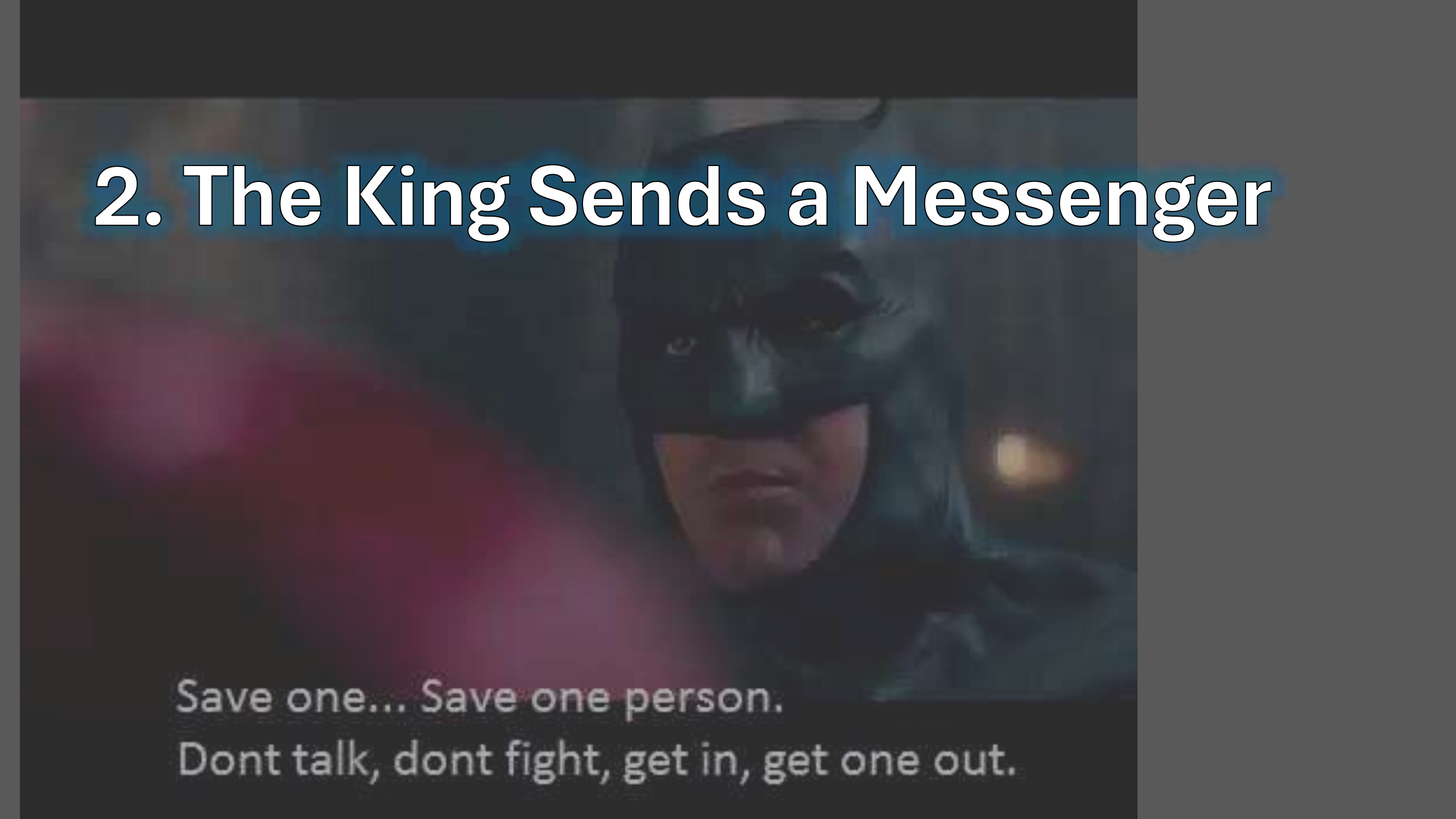
The Flash/Batman Moment

Many believers freeze at the word evangelism, thinking they must save everyone and have all the answers.



Save one... Save one person.
Dont talk, dont fight, get in, get one out.

Romans 10:1-4

- "Brothers and sisters, my heart's desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be saved."**
- "They are zealous for God, but their zeal is not based on knowledge."**
- "Christ is the culmination of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes."**

The King Sends a Messenger

Before strategy, Paul shows his heart: “My heart’s desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be *saved*” (Romans 10:1).

The King Sends a Messenger

Evangelism begins with a burden and
prayer for a specific person,
not a script.

The King Sends a Messenger

Paul notes the Israelites were zealous but

misdirected, building their own ladder

instead of resting on Christ's

finished work.

Romans 10:5-10

- **"The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart... the message concerning faith that we proclaim."**
- **"If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."**
- **"It is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved."**

3. Confess, Believe, Everyone Included

Salvation is simple: confess “Jesus is *Lord*”

and believe God *raised* Him from the dead

(Romans 10:9–10).

Confess, Believe, Everyone Included

It's a heart that believes and a mouth that confesses—

not a theology *exam*.

Romans 10:11-13

- "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame."
- "There is no difference between Jew and Gentile — the same Lord is Lord of all."
- "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Confess, Believe, Everyone Included

Paul erases insider/outsider lines:

“*Everyone* who

calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

4. How Will They Hear?

Romans 10:14–15 traces a chain: people can't call, believe, or hear unless someone is *sent* to tell them.

Romans 10:14-15

- "How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in?"
- "How can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard?"
- "How can they hear without someone preaching to them?"
- "How can anyone preach unless they are sent?"
- "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

Transition: This is the Word of the Lord. Let's pray, then dig into what it means for us.

How Will They Hear?

You might be “Plan A” for the person on your heart—no theology degree required.

How Will They Hear?

Paul praises “beautiful *feet*,” meaning feet that move toward someone, not eloquent words.

5. Three Challenges: Pray, Invite, Walk Together

PRAY (Romans 10:1): Pray by *name* for the one person on your heart, asking God to soften their heart and give you an opportunity.

5. Three Challenges: Pray, Invite, Walk Together

INVITE (Romans 10:14): Simply invite them to **church**, acting as a herald, not an expert—an awkward invite beats permanent regret.

5. Three Challenges: Pray, Invite, Walk Together

WALK TOGETHER

(Romans 10:15): Go further by showing up alongside them—offer a ride, share coffee afterward, and mirror the shape of Romans 10.

Closing Challenge

Remember Batman's line: "Just save one"—not the whole world, just one.
