Romans 10:1–15 — You Are the Messenger, Not the Message

1. The Flash/Batman Moment

In *Justice League*, Batman tells the overwhelmed Flash, “**Just save _____ person.**”

Many believers freeze at the word **evangelism**, thinking they must save _____ and have all the answers.

But we are **not the Savior** that’s the Holy Spirit’s job—so our task is simply to be a **messenger for _____ person.**

2. The King Sends a Messenger

Before strategy, Paul shows his heart: “My heart’s desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be _____” (Romans 10:1).

Evangelism begins with a **burden and ____** for a specific person, not a script.

Paul notes the Israelites were **zealous but _____**, building their own ladder instead of resting on Christ’s finished work.

Many people today need someone to gently point that out.

3. Confess, Believe, Everyone Included

Salvation is simple: confess “**Jesus is _____**” and believe God _____ Him from the dead (Romans 10:9–10).

It’s a heart that believes and a mouth that confesses—not a **theology _____**. Paul erases insider/outsider lines: “_____ who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

Romans 10:14–15 traces a chain: people can’t call, believe, or hear unless someone is _____ to tell them.

Paul praises “**beautiful _____**,” meaning feet that move toward someone, not eloquent words.

6. Which of the three challenges (Pray, Invite, Walk Together) feels hardest for you right now, and why?
7. What's one practical way you can move your 'feet' toward someone this week?
